Genre Exercise: Horror Project

Assignment: You will write and shoot a short Horror scene that is a slice of a larger horror film. You can think of this a single scene from a horror film to prove that you can work within the limits of a specific genre.

Project Requirements:

Less than 4 minutes
Must be a scene from a large horror story
Uses at least 3 (three) horror tropes from TV Tropes
At least one of those tropes moves past a cliché use of that trope
Use no more than five sentences of dialog
Uses no more than three actors (can be from outside this class)
Shot in 1 (one) location
Group members occupy different roles than they did on the PSA project
Screenplay is written in full and on Celtx
Shot list and blocking diagrams are complete prior to shooting
Final day to shoot is 2/15

This should be as high a quality project as possible. It will be your second submission to the All-American High School Film Festival.
