## Inciting Incident Screenwriting Assignment

**The Assignment:** You will write the Inciting Incident for the feature length screenplay you have been developing. Write your scene on Celtx. It should be a fully written scene that includes all elements of a screenplay.

- Slug Lines
- Action
- Dialogue
- Character Introductions (if necessary)

**Inciting Incident**: The Inciting Incident is the scene that radically upsets the balance of the character's life. It is usually NOT the first scene of a film, but is near the beginning. Think of it as the scene that gets the ball rolling for the main story of the film.

## Examples:

*Dog Day Afternoon*: The Inciting Incident is the scene when the police arrive at the bank. *Citizen Kane*: The Inciting Incident is the scene when Thompson is sent to find out what Rosebud means.

*Chinatown*: The Inciting Incident is the scene when Gittes finds out that Mrs. Mulwray did not actually hire him.

Requirements: You must meet the following Criteria for Success in order to receive full credit.

- 1. Your scene should include all proper screenplay formatting elements (Slug Lines, Action, Dialogue, etc.).
- 2. Your scene should be between 5 and 15 pages long.
- 3. Your scene should ACTUALLY be the Inciting Incident of the story (see definition above).
- 4. Your scene should contain NO spelling or grammar errors (unless important for character dialogue).
- 5. Your scene should reflect writing from the inside-out (are characters' actions and dialogue written to reflect character motivation and background, NOT what YOU would say or do?).
- 6. You also need to complete your Story Doc. I will be reading it too. The Story Doc gives me context for your Inciting Incident. If you have changed your story, you need to update your Story Doc.
